Featured Quilt Kits

This week's featured quilt is [Presents](#), a great quilt to make as a table topper or a wall hanging. Made with 10" squares (perfect for using Layer Cakes), the quilt measures 43" x 43" and you can even get the backing out of leftover Layer Cakes. The pattern sells for \$12 and is part of a four-pattern series called Quick as a Wink III. But we are offering the pattern **and** the [fabric kit](#) for just \$44.00 right now as a special treat for you (regular price is \$58.00). These kits come in two colorways - lively lights made from Merry & Bright by Sandy Gervais for Moda, or the rich dark fabrics of Birchwood Lane by Holly Taylor. There's a certain holiday coming up in just four short months - this quilt is a great way to start your holiday decorating - or gift giving.



Last week we told you about [Victoria Rose](#), a lovely three-fabric quilt in blacks and creams. This kit uses the [Fit to be Geese](#) ruler, and can also be created with the optional [Mini Fit to be Geese](#) ruler. Victoria Rose is the perfect lap size at 51" x 74" and costs \$68.00 for the pattern and kit;

\$60 for the kit only.

And don't forget [Box of Chocolates](#), using S'mores, a fun and whimsical fabric line from Moda featuring 18 assorted fat quarters. Just a reminder - this kit is still on sale. Box of Chocolates is a fun, fast lap quilt that makes for a great weekend project! The cost of the kit is \$50.00 and includes the pattern. Hurry before all of these great kits are gone!

Tips

Have you ever wondered why it's necessary to cut setting triangles two different ways? There's a great reason for that - the bias of the fabric needs to be in the inside of the quilt so that the edges won't stretch. When you cut a square diagonally, twice, the resulting triangles are used for the ends of each diagonally-set row and the bias edge is along the short edges. If you cut a square diagonally once, the

resulting triangles are used to "cap" each of the four corners of the quilt and the bias is along the long edge for these.
